4 Review of the past year

Barry reported that Christelle, Chair of the French Twinning committee, had told him she thought the French were unlikely to go ahead with the visit rescheduled for May 2021. It is possible that some English hosts may feel anxious about accommodating people from France. Nigel felt that we should make provisional arrangements, though without financial commitment. We can review the situation in January. We can see what our members are thinking, and also what the French want to do. Barry will advise Christelle that we are keeping the dates open; we are leaving it on the table; but also mention the possibility of rescheduling the weekend to September/October.
